Microchip

Your dog needs to be microchipped with a chip that meets ISO standards. The chip serves as an ID and is required so your dog can be clearly linked to their pet passport while abroad. If your dog doesn't already have a chip, make sure to get this done before your trip. The microchip number will be recorded in the pet passport.

Rabies Vaccination

A rabies vaccination is an absolute must for entering Montenegro. Your dog must be vaccinated against rabies at least 21 days before your trip, and the vaccination must still be valid at the time of travel. The proof of vaccination is recorded in the pet passport. Without this, your dog will either be denied entry at the border or placed in quarantine.

Deworming and Other Vaccinations

Deworming and additional vaccinations, such as for leptospirosis or distemper, aren't strictly required but are highly recommended to protect your dog from local diseases.
